- ★ Welcome & Introduction of Officers: Jess Marshall & Michele Hildebrand-Co-Presidents, Jeannette Blaustein -Vice-President, Janet Blanco-Treasurer, Aimee Aubry-Secretary
- ★ Guest Speaker: Mrs Collins: "State of the Charter Schools"
- Mrs Collins presented a presentation regarding the status and history of the charter schools.
- The following was covered
 - 1. COVID cases data within the school system. Safety protocols and success with following these protocols. 14 Teacher infection, 87 Students infected and 955 students/Staff quarantined for possible exposure.
 - 2. Number of students, educator and staff of 3,481in our charter system.
 - 3. Mental Health Initiatives past and plans for the future.
 - 4. C.A.R.E.S ACT provided \$673,000 for use of long term sub hiring, Sanitation equipment, Learning software, webcams and additional Chrome books for one on one use.
 - 5. Working on Cognia Accreditation. Delayed due to the need for the overwhelming polices and procedures of COVID-19. Will select a new date in the fall of 2021 to determine accreditation renewal status.
 - 6. Strategic plan objectives. School vision, school mission, teacher profess develop, Teacher starting pay, hiring schedules, streamline maintenance schedules, Governing board professional development and branding community outreach.
 - 7. Oasis STEM Makerspace plan
 - Question regarding overall state of the union and financial plan.
 - Mrs. Collins stated they went to a COW meeting (discussion forum to discuss charter schools); positive outcome; charter schools are considered a core value; it brings people to the city; they want to make sure charter school is sustained; only two people that said they wanted to take it to a referendum to see if the taxpayers support it; if that happens we will need to rally parents; restructuring lease so more money can be spent on students instead of capex. Mrs. Collins left feeling really good about the city council's support of the charter schools.
- ★ Foundation Update: Rally Information (www.CapeCharterFoundation.org Samantha Richardson and Jen-Hope Belis discussed the details of Rally on the Green for 2021. Golf only event without games and vendors due to COVID. Details on the online auction were provided. 100% of proceeds for auction items provided by clubs or
