➤ **2019 Budget Approval** - Total budgeted income is \$95,450.00; total budgeted expenses are \$91,370.00.

❖ **Treasurer's Report** -

- **Income** - Fun cards and Smencil sales at open house raised \$2,228.66.
- **Expenses** - Boo-Hoo breakfast was an expense \$149.13, the deposit for the Fall Festival inflatables was \$922.50, teacher reimbursement is currently at \$1,700 and staff appreciation is at \$456.21. We are currently at \$3,227.84 for total expenses.
- **Escrow** - Mr. Christopher Cann requested last year that the PTO start an escrow account for school improvements. Last year we kept a spreadsheet of all the expenses that were incurred. Ms. Grecsek has asked for that money up front to purchase the smart boards for the classroom. A check has been written out to the school and is being given to Ms. Grecsek tonight in the amount of \$28,223.06 to purchase the smart boards. Once Boostheron is over, a \$15,000 check will be made out to the school to cover the rest of the smart board purchase.

❖ **Governing Board Representative Report** - Christopher Jackson introduced himself as the Parent Representative.

- The charter schools will be put together to be more cohesive. The names of the schools will be changing from OES to Oasis South and CME will be Oasis North. Approval is still pending from the Lee County school system.

❖ **Principal's Report** - MaryBeth Grecsek, Interim Principal introduced Carrie Abes, Interim Assistant Principal and thanked her for the hours and hard word she has put in. Carrie came to OES from CME.

- **Branding Process** - This will be overtime, it will not be an overnight change. There will be a change in uniform colors. This is still pending a few different levels of approval.
- **PE teacher Introduction** - Ms. Esmeralda Arroyo is a Certified Personal Trainer. Her passion is teaching children and educating them on understanding their body and how it works. Stay tuned for Family Fitness nights!
- **Boards for Classrooms** - We are still looking at a couple of different brands but leaning towards the Promethium boards. They are a lot like the smart boards. Lee County School District uses the Promethium boards so we are going to try to piggyback off their negotiated price.
- **FSA Points** - This year we have the most points in Lee County for any elementary school in the district at 533 out of 700 points! CME is in second with 513 points!
- **MindUP** - Teaching students about focused awareness. This lesson focuses on teaching them to relax their minds and be mindful of what is going on in their day.
- **PBIS app** - If you are struggling with downloading the app, come into the office for Carrie to assist you.
- **Internet Safety** - Ms. Grecsek, Carrie, the School Counselor and the school SRO have started a taskforce and created a presentation to educate our 4th and 5th graders of the dangers of electronic devices and social media.

❖ **Open discussion:**

- Morning news room - Ms. Grecsek explained that any Gmail account that is a branded (school) account has been shut down by Google for posting on YouTube. The news is currently being announced on the overhead. We have purchased something to resolve this issue but have not gotten it up and running yet. The only way to post to YouTube currently is by using a personal account which we do not feel is appropriate.
- Changes to lunches with students - Administrative was concerned with student safety as parents were leaving with their child without signing them out last year so to try to prevent this, we created a schedule with certain days (2 days a week) for certain grade levels. Each Quarter the days will be switched that each grade level can come to lunch. Having the door leading into the office will help.
- Background checks? What website are they ran through? - 5-year checks are sent to our administrative office to run a more thorough check on the individual. The yearly search is done by an arrest search through Lee Clerk, a sexual predator search and 2 other searches (Ms. Grecsek was not 100% sure of the websites). Carrie confirmed that they go to 4 different websites to put in the information and complete the search on the individuals.
